1. Apologies for Absence.

2. To confirm the minutes of the 121st Annual Assembly held on 15th April 2015

3. Matters arising from the Minutes.

4. Chairman's Report.

The Chairman delivered his report outlining the efforts the Parish Council to reduce the speed of traffic on the Street some of which had had a positive impact. These included the forthcoming installation of a VAS sign on the approaches to the station.

The Council had commented on a large number of planning issues with considerable emphasis on the new Draft Guildford Local Plan. In particular the Council had opposed suggestions of a secondary school on the Cuckoo Farm site. A revised version would be put to consultation in June. Other significant objections had been made to proposals at the Drift Golf Club and at Newlands Corner.

A range of maintenance tasks had been undertaken on footpaths and on the recreation ground

Section137 payments were made to support the village school and the Church with section 106 support acquired to support development in the village hall car park and the playground.

The Chairmen thanked Councillors and the Clerk for their support during the year.

Councillors approved the report.

5. Clandon Charities

Stephen Meredith reported that the Trustees had received £3000 had from the Henry Smith Charity as in previous years.

The Trustees had identified suitable beneficiaries with efforts focussed on older residents and those of limited means with 37 people receiving cheques just before Christmas.
