	however confirms that no changes are envisaged in the bus service through	
	West Clandon.	
	Councillor Keith Taylor adds, "You will recall that I previously mentioned that	
	the County were undertaking a review of local bus services. Particularly given	
	that most of the bus services through our villages are heavily subsidised by	
	the Council Taxpayer, I urged you to make representations in support of retaining these services and to encourage local residents to do likewise. I	
	have obviously also made strong representations myself in support of them.	
	I am pleased to say that none of these changes significantly affect the current	
	bus services through our villages. A few Send and West Clandon residents	
	might be slightly affected by the routing change in the 515 Sunday service to	
	and from Kingston.	
	You will see from Mike's email that there is a further and final consultation on	
	these proposals, running until June 8th. I do not think that there is any	
	particular need for your Parish Councils to respond to this further	
	consultation, unless any of them are minded just to welcome the retention of	
	the particular services through your villages. However, I do not think that we	
	should be complacent about the situation on local bus services. We should still be doing all that we can to encourage more local resident to use them. As	
	with many other village facilities, it is likely, in the long term, to be a case of	
	"use it or lose it". I am also doing all that I can to promote improvements to	
	the infrastructure supporting these services e.g. more and better bus	
	shelters, real time information on both displays in shelters and on mobile	
	phone apps etc. As someone who tries to set a good example by using local	
	bus services myself, I am aware of the importance of such improvements in	
	encouraging wider usage."	ļ
