## Headlines from the October meeting of the Parish Council

## Projects Progressed

- A gate is to be installed at the tennis court end of the Children's play area to make it easier for tennis players to retrieve lost balls from the undergrowth.
- The defibrillator set to be installed on the wall of the Village Hall is on order and should be installed shortly.
- Following a site visit by Surrey Highways we are awaiting a report and costings for the installation of a second electronic speed sign on the Street near Clandon Regis.
- Quotes have been sought for the extension of the 'Grassform' area of the village hall car park to improve access and circulation.


## Representations made

- Confirmation received that, following objections made to the planning authorities, permission for the conversion of a stable block to residential accommodation on land north of Lime Grove has been refused.
- The lock on the gate on footpath 69 (off Green Lane) has been removed as has the electric fence in the field behind Oak Grange Rd.
- Council objections to the slip roads proposed at Burnt Common have been sent to the Wisley Planning Appeal which is set to conclude next week.

## Progress at Clandon Park

- Paul Cook of the National Trust updated councillors on the outcomes of the consultation on options for the rebuilding of Clandon Park. He was delighted with feedback on the proposals and the engagement of the local community.

- There would be a more detailed feasibility study with final designs available for further consultation next year.
